Early Xmas present for FEC children

CHRISTMAS, it appears, came early last week for kids at CAMARTEC Nursery School, located in Kikwe area, Arumeru District after MISERIOR -a Roman Catholic Relief Agency from Germany - in conjunction with a group of German nationals handed over a modern dining hall worth 4.2m/-

The agency representative, Eckard Krause, handed over the building to the the Arumeru District Education Officer (DEO), Ms Fortunate Kabeja, last Saturday.

The nursery school. which caters for children aged between three and seven years, provides an important service to the community.

Traditionally it relied on support of local communities. but last week's handing-over of the dining room marked the start of the much appreciated foreign donation.

The school headteacher, Mrs Anna Mshana, and teaching staff members, Ufoo Munisi and Honorina Mpingana, said the donation was a big boost to the school's efforts to provide

quality education to the children

CAMARTEC Nursery school was established in 1983 by Nambala villagers and workers of the nearby Centre for Agricultural Mechanisation and Rural Technology (CAMARTEC). The school serves Nambala, Tengeru and Nganana locations.

Supervised by Mr Krause from Germany, the project, that started in May this year and completed early this month, cost 4.2m/-.

Before the new structure. the school used another small building as a dining hall.

Modern sec. school for Maasai community in offing

A SECONDARY school that will be the largest and the most modern in Simaniiro District in Manyara Region is under construction.

The school, to cater mainly for the Maasai is being community, constructed in the mineralrich Mirerani area by three organisations that have come together to help education projects in the region.

Chief advisor to the school project, Lenganasa Soipey, said the first phase of the project started this month and was expected to be complete by January 2006.

Initially, he said, 90 students will be enrolled for Form One early next year. Phase two of the project would commence immediately after completion of the first phase, he added.

"The modern secondary school will mainly cater for the Maasai community in

A total of 508,911,600/- is required for phase one and two of the project, the money which will be raised through co-ordinated fund-rising efforts spearheaded by three local partners operating at Mirerani. They are TanzaniteOne, World Vision and the Nasinvai community.

We plan to start with Form One and then extend to Forms Two, Three and Four in the near future,", said an official with the mining giant, TanzaniteOne.

Soipey TanzaniteOne and World* Vision would spearhead fundraising for building materials and technical support while the Nasinyai community was contributing labour and available materials.

A total of sixteen will classrooms constructed of which eight have already been completed.

He said Paradiso Minerals Limited has made generous contribution but 40m/- more is needed to be raised. In this

TanzaniteOne, collaboration with the Mirerani community, has organized a fund raising event tomorrow.

"There are over fifty companies currently operating in Mirerani but TanzaniteOne and Paradiso Minerals Limited have shown real interest in the school project for the Maasai community," Mr Soipey said, calling on other companies to work for the development of the people of the area.

This project marks a prestigious milestone in achieving objectives of strengthening ties between mining stakeholders and the community and providing the local children with right to education," he said.

Mr Soipey praised Tanzanite Foundation for its leading role in promoting education in the area.
